When Nev was diagnosed with several chronic arthritic conditions, his occupational therapist recommended art therapy to help manage his pain. Since then, art has

become an important part of Nev's life as he doesn't experience any pain while he is painting.

Nev is also quick to point out, Suncare's Art Group is about so much more than pain management. He enjoys getting out of the house and socialising with the other members of the group. "Being here to paint and being here for other people is great for de-stressing... it's better than any medication," he says.

Nev enjoys the process of choosing what to paint by using his iPad, provided through Suncare's Digital Program. He also makes beautiful wooden frames for his artwork.

Reducing your risk of falls is important for living independently and safely at home.

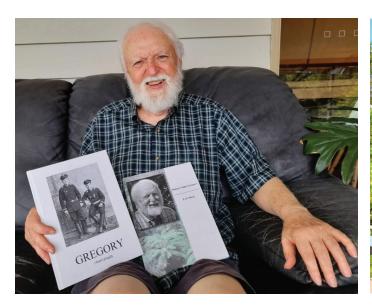
To help, Suncare offers the 'Stepping On' program which provides participants with proactive skills and knowledge for preventing falls and promoting active ageing.

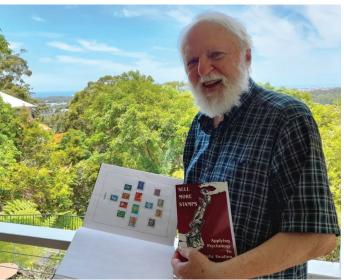
The program offers safety tips for at home and when out in the community, introduces strength and balance exercises, provides information about safe footwear and assistance with other health and wellbeing matters.

Ingredients

2 cups fresh basil leaves, packed (Sweet or Sacred Basil) 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil 1/3 cup (75g) pine nuts 3 garlic cloves, minced 1/4 tsp salt 1/8 tsp freshly ground black pepper

Method

- 1. Place basil leaves and pine nuts into food processor and pulse several times.
- 2. Add garlic and Parmesan cheese and pulse several times more. Scrape down sides of food processor with spatula.
- 3. While food processor is running, add olive oil slowly to prevent separating and scrape down sides of food processor.
- 4. Stir in salt and pepper.

Notes

Toss with pasta for a quick sauce, dollop over baked potatoes or spread onto crackers or toasted slices of bread. This recipe makes approximately 1 cup of pesto. Basil pesto darkens when exposed to air, so to store, cover tightly with plastic wrap but avoid plastic touching top of pesto.

If you plan to freeze your pesto, omit the cheese as it doesn't freeze well. To use, defrost and add grated Parmesan cheese.
